- Federal program and funding provided under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
- Provides financial assistance to schools with high percentages of children from low-income families
- Helps ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards

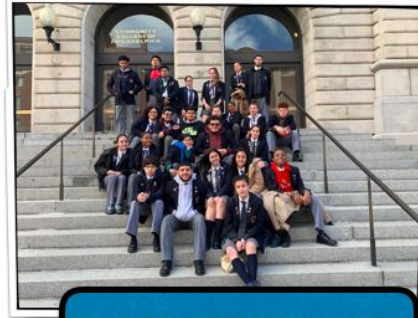

 - Events: Literacy Night, STEAM Night, etc.

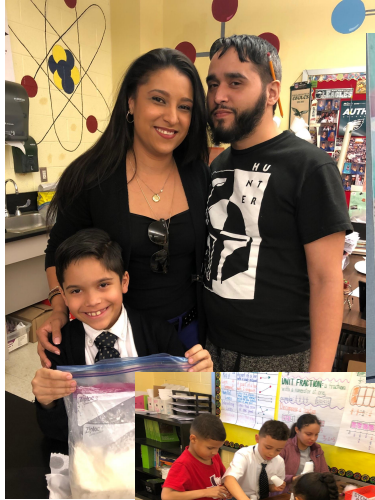

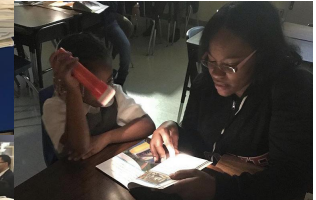

- Provides supplemental funding for English Language Learners (ELs) and Immigrant Students
- Assists children in learning English and meeting the challenging state academic content and state achievement standards
- Supplements a wide array of educational services and activities that support ELs in developing English language proficiency for both the academic and social settings

Title III Funds

- Amount for SY 2019-2020 = \$30,204.

- Use of Funds

- Professional development and ESL Specialist Certification Programs
- ESL iPads and other instructional technologies
- Communication services, such as Language Line
- ESL family outreach and services
- Supplemental instructional materials
- Experiential learning opportunities for ELs
